Dynamic presentations, interpretation of the latest research, probing conversations, theological reflection, and vibrant prayer and liturgies await you at the National Ministry Summit, all in Orlando — a city known for imagination and creativity!

For the past four years the **Emerging Models of Pastoral Leadership Project** hosted a national conversation for today's pastoral leaders. More than 700 creative and dedicated men and women gathered in locations around the country to discuss evolving leadership roles and parish structures. Bishops met in focus groups, lay and ordained pastoral leaders responded to surveys, and young adult leaders contacted us online. Findings were studied and analyzed. Implications named. Pastoral leaders are identifying the trends, challenges, and growth edges of pastoral leadership. Collectively, they are anticipating a future filled with hope.

The scope of this research is deep and wide-ranging, looking at the evolving role of pastoral leaders, lay and ordained, who are caring for God's people in the midst of significant transitions in parish life.

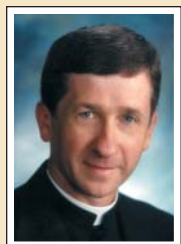

He is a member of the Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy and the Ad Hoc Committee on Scripture Translation. He serves as the Episcopal Advisor to the Emerging Models of Pastoral Leadership Project.

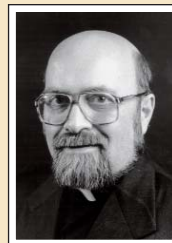

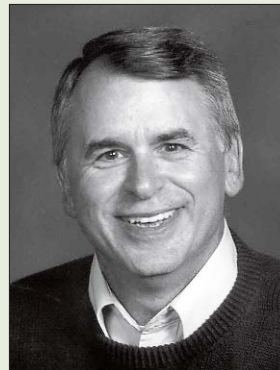
1. Pastoring Multiple Parishes

An increasing number of pastors and pastoral leaders are being asked to lead or serve in more than one parish community. Referred to as clustering or twinning, this reality is significantly impacting the parish, the pastor, and the parish staff. Recent research suggests that at present between 35% and 40% of all parishes in the United States now share a pastor with at least one other parish or mission. Diocesan surveys, research and pilot gatherings of those involved in this ministry were hosted by the Emerging Models Project in order to discover some of the questions, issues, and implications of multiple parish pastoring.

2. Parish Life Coordinators and Sacramental Ministers (Canon 517.2)

FACILITATED BY

Brian Reynolds, Ed.D. and Kathleen Hendricks

Calling forth religious, laity, and deacons to provide pastoral leadership in parishes without a resident pastor, bishops across the U.S. have been installing parish life coordinators (PLCs) under Canon 517.2, for more than twenty years. Together with sacramental ministers, PLCs sustain parish life for the People of God. Working with the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA), the Emerging Models Project has conducted an in-depth study of the use of this Canon. Focus groups of bishops were conducted, along with surveys of all identified PLCs. Findings were then validated in research gatherings of Canon 517.2 leaders.

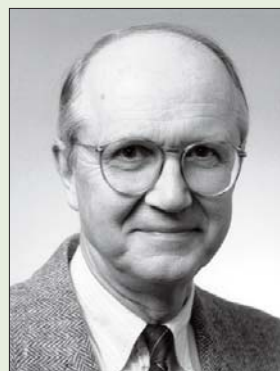

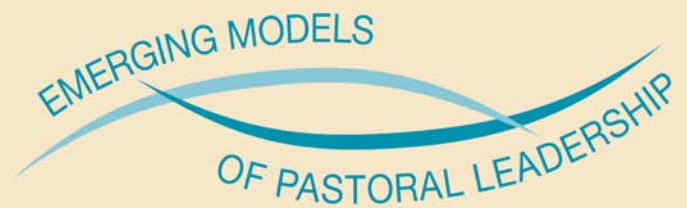
